Lions are an international network of 1.3 million men and women in 202 countries and geographic areas who work together to answer the needs that challenge communities around the world.

Known for working to end preventable blindness, testing for diabetes, and hearing problems, Lions also participate in a vast variety of projects that are important to their communities. These projects cover a range of activities from cleaning up local parks to providing supplies to victims of natural disasters and adopt a highway programs.

The Alamance Community Lions Club provides support to the visually and hearing impaired individuals here in our own community as well as through state and national Lions programs. In North Carolina, these include such programs as medical eye research at Duke University, operation of Camp Dogwood, a summer camp for the blind at little or no cost to the blind campers, and facilities improvements at the Boys and Girls Homes of North Carolina.

Dedicated to community service in Southeast Guilford County, we provide financial and hands-on assistance to the Alamance Community Park, home to Southeast Youth Baseball Organization. We provide financial support to the handicapped-accessible children's playground being built by private citizens at Hagan Stone Park, and gifts to the YMCA's Camp Weaver and the Greensboro YMCA. Senior citizens with specific needs and individuals dealing with misfortune are also beneficiaries of our support.

Each year we find new needs in young children and adults with sight problems. When circumstances warrant, Lions help with funding and arranging for eye exams and glasses. When the schedule allows it, we bring the NC Lions' "Vision screening Van" to Southeast Guilford. The screening van, equipped with state-of-the-art vision screening equipment and staffed by volunteers and professionals, is made available at no cost to all community members choosing to take advantage of the service.
