Southeast High School is on the bond for over **33 million dollars**.

Renovations include adding 360 new seats, media center and gymnasium addition.

Southeast High School's current student population is approximately 1340 students. Southeast high school currently has 17 mobile classes. At an average class size of 26 students, that equates to over 440 students being taught in mobile units. That's a third of the student population. There are approximately 14 "Roving" teachers due to the fact that there is no classroom space to accommodate them. Southeast High School desperately needs these renovations.

Southeast High School was allotted 1.9 million dollars for a cafeteria renovation several years ago. This money was left over funding from the 2000 bond. Due to water and sewer issues the renovation has not materialized. However, the sewer lines have been completed and the parking lots repaved. At the 1/31/08 School Board Meeting, the school board gave an update on the Southeast High school cafeteria renovation, design has been completed, bidding process should start in April and construction will happen this summer.

The 2008 School bond is for \$412 million dollars. The bond includes 27 projects. Of those 27 projects 5 of them are Southeast projects totaling over \$100 million.
